	Dense, silvery cushions with big rose/pink flowers ~10cm tall; from Kaz Dag, Turkey: 1600m.		
A340	<b>Acanthus hirsutus</b>		\$14
	Prickly, toothed leaves; 45cm spikes of creamy yellow flowers with green hoods. Jurasek collection from Dedegol Dag, Turkey at 1800m.		
A375	<b>Achillea ageratifolia</b>	Sun	\$10
	Greek Yarrow, 10-20cm in height with aromatic silver foliage and bright white flowers. M. Rejzek collection from Babuna, Macedonia at 1120m.		
A280	<b>Aethionema saxatilis</b>	Sun	\$9
	Blue-green, thick (almost succulent like) leaves form a low mat of 10-15cm. Flowers are usually pink, but there is variability with white and mauve as well. Jurasek collection, 1700m Greece.		
A382	<b>Allium cupanii ssp. hirtovaginatium</b>	Sun	\$12
New	Tuft of linear leaves, just 5-10cm in height. Large pink flowers, varying from light to dark pink in colour. Choice collection by M. Pavelka; Ulu Dag, Turkey.		
A147	<b>Allium flavum v. minus</b>	Sun	\$10
	Dwarf form from Turkey with umbels of bright yellow flowers; delightfully curled leaves, 12cm..		
A219	<b>Allium forrestii</b>	Sun	\$10
	A diminutive species growing at 4500m on the rocky slopes of Beima Shan in Yunnan; big red/purple flowers on short stems.		
A288	<b>Allium kurtzianum</b>	Sun	\$10
	Dense pinkish-purple clusters in summer. Grows to just 10cm high; excellent trough specimen. Rare endemic of NW Turkey; Jurasek collection.		
A362	<b>Allium senescens ssp. glaucum</b>	Sun	\$10
	The bluish-gray, flat, curling "cowlick onion" leaves just can't be ignored in any garden, including the rockery. Drought tolerant, deer resistant, and a much appreciated late summer bloomer of pink globes. Half the size of the species with leaves reaching 15cm in height.		
A284	<b>Allium sikkimense</b>	Sun	\$10
New	Very desirable thin leaved, petite blue allium for rock garden and trough. A more than welcome bloom in August and September.		
A385	<b>Allium sp. Rawu</b>	Sun	\$10
New	Pink flowered allium; from Jurasek seed collected in Rawu, E. Tibet at 4100m.		
A386	<b>Allium sphaerocephalon</b>	Sun	\$10
New	Stems (60cm) hold dense, oval, drumstick flower heads, oddly resembling maroon-red clover. Grassy leaves are elegant, thin and about 40cm in height. M. Rejzek collection from Ereğ Dagi, Turkey at 2000m.		
A307	<b>Allium thunbergii alba</b>	Sun	\$9
	Just when you think the garden is done for the season, this easy to please gem brightens the day. Forms tidy clumps; stems 20cm high hold clear white blooms until frost.		
A318	<b>Allium thunbergii 'Ozawa'</b>	Sun Part-sun	\$9
	Just when you think all plants will have shut down blooming in the fall, this allium wakes up and gives you one last bouquet. And the flowers last for months, even after light frosts! Elegant 'Ozawa' flowers are held about 30cm high; rich purple with reddish undertones. Delicate, grassy leaves don't distract from the blooms. Very easy to grow, and the deer of course don't like them. From Gabriella Costea seed.		
A194	<b>Allium virgunculae</b>	Sun	\$10
	A very dainty allium with thin green leaves in a neat tuft bearing blue/purple flowers in the autumn until frost. Lacking a name only adds to its allure. 10 cm		
A324	<b>Alyssum oxycarpum</b>	Sun	\$10
	Mounds of tiny grey green leaves with profusion of yellow blooms in early spring.		
A137	<b>Andromeda polifolia Ft. Chimo</b>	Sun	\$11
	A collection from northern Canada which has proven to be a good grower; needle like leaves of bluish green; pink flowers; 30cm.		
A380	<b>Androsace aff. villosa ET</b>	Sun	\$12
New	A Halda collection from dry limestone rocks in Eastern Tibet at 5200m; tight, densely hairy cushions with white flowers.		
A367	<b>Androsace aff. villosa JJH11-35</b>	Sun	\$12
New	Halda collection from dry limestone rocks at 5200m in Eastern Tibet. White flowers on soft, hairy cushions, like A. helvetica.

	Halda collected seed of this species in Upper Burma on Mali Kha in a high alpine pasture (4800m); stemless, lavender flowers sit atop tight cushions of hairy leaves, resembling a miniature form of <i>a. muscoidea</i> , very choice introduction.		
A151	<b>Androsace minor</b>	Sun	\$12
	From 4200m Kangding , Sechuan; bright, lime green rosettes, very miniature in size; large white flowers.		
A118	<b>Androsace muscoidea</b>	Sun	\$12
	Silvery green, stoloniferous mats; stemless lavender flowers; from drier regions of the Himalaya.		
A010	<b>Androsace primuloides 'Sheppard'</b>	Sun Part-sun	\$12
	Large vigorous plant with many gray-green rosettes of elliptic leaves, each one producing, in May, a compact umbel of pink flowers with a yellow eye, lovely where given the room to form a solid carpet.		
A283	<b>Androsace robusta ssp. purpurea</b>	Sun	\$14
	Reddish-purple flowers on tight cushions. Pavelka collection from 4000m Annapurna, Himalayas, Nepal.		
A154	<b>Androsace sarmentosa</b>	Sun Part-sun	\$10
	From a wild collection at 3300m, Garwal. Soft cushions of lonate leaves, rose/pink flowers with a dark eye; spreads into larger mats.		
A065	<b>Androsace sempervivoides</b>	Sun Part-sun	\$12
New	A neat, mat forming species with deep green, succulent leaves. Bright pink flowers on short stems.		
A014	<b>Androsace villosa v. jacquemontii</b>	Part-sun	\$12
	Originally from Ota Vlasak, this collection is stoloniferous and mat forming, but slow. Flowers are a vivid red-purple with greenish yellow eyes, quite striking.		
A189	<b>Androsace x 'millstream'</b>	Sun	\$12
	Linc Foster's selection of a tiny garden seedling with dark green leaves and pink flowers.		
A125	<b>Anemone blanda 'enem'</b>	Sun Part-sun	\$14
	Collected by Janis Ruksans in the North Caucasus and named for a nearby village. The true species covered with absolutely pure gentian blue flowers in April. Easy to grow in gravelly/woody soil.		
A347	<b>Anemone occidentalis</b>	Sun	\$12
	In the mountains, the long silky mop seedheads are as memorable as the creamy flowers that are produced on 100cm clumps of lacinate leaves. Alplains collection from Yakima Co., WA at 1677m.		
A320	<b>Anemone sp. Sichuan</b>	Sun Part-sun	\$14
	Low growing tuft with almost prostrate stems of white flowers when open, but distinctive purple undersides of petals are what really add the interest. Not showy, but very subtly attractive. J. Jurasek collection ex Sichuan in 2013.		
A145	<b>Anemone x lesseri</b>	Sun Part-sun	\$10
	A garden origin hybrid with shiny green, palmate leaves, to 15cm tall; many rose flowers about 2cm across.		
A391	<b>Antennaria chilensis</b>	Sun	\$11
New	Very nice low, 5cm mat of silver felted pointed leaves; heads of white flowers. Jurasek collection from La Parva, Chile at 3450m.		
A070	<b>Antennaria dioica 'nyewoods'</b>	Sun Part-sun	\$10
	A fine pink flowered form. Makes dense carpets of green and silver.		
A285	<b>Anthemis cretica ssp. carpatica</b>	Sun	\$10
	Large solitary white flowers in summer on cushions of silvery-grey pinnatisect leaves. Jurasek collection from Ulu Dag, Turkey; 2100m.		
A165	<b>Anthemis cretica ssp. leucanthemoides</b>	Sun Part-sun	\$11
New	From Turkey, an absolutely flat mat with filigreed silvery green leaves and white flowers; the best form.		
A286	<b>Aquilegia barnebyi (mini form)</b>	Sun	\$10
	Miniature form of <i>A. barnebyi</i> - possibly genetic or from exposed conditions. Juicy dark peach sepals with yellow corollas. Alplains collection; Rio Blanco Co. CO, 2576m.		
A381	<b>Aquilegia bertolonii 'Blue Berry'</b>	Sun Part-sun	\$10
New			
A374	<b>Aquilegia coerulea</b>		\$10
	The Rocky Mountain Columbine - featuring large, showy blue flowers with white sepals and long spurs.

	Minute 10cm plants of gray-green leaves; dwarfed by the large, blue and white, long spurred flowers. Choice Alplains collection from east-facing steep screes of dolomite in Piute Co., UT, 3338m.		
A373	<b>Aquilegia scopulorum Sanpete Co (UT)</b>		\$14
	Tight gray-green tuft, from a larger growing population. Sizable bi-colored blue and white blooms with long spurs. Alplains collection from south and east-facing screes of dolomite near timberline in Sanpete Co., UT at 3290m.		
A263	<b>Aquilegia x micrantha</b>	Sun Part-sun	\$10
	Hybrid collection from Colorado. Having the sticky leaves of a. micrantha, but the yellow corolla and peach coloured spurs speak of a. elegantula.		
A287	<b>Arabis bryoides</b>	Sun Part-sun	\$12
	Tidy, tight cushion of heavily tomentose leaves giving it a soft appearance. Covered in white flowers in spring.		
A021	<b>Arabis ferdinandi-coburgii 'Variegata'</b>	Sun Part-sun	\$9
	Waxy leaves with a yellow/green variegation. Useful mat-forming species; white flowers.		
A041	<b>Arctostaphylos uva ursi 'Wood's Red'</b>	Sun	\$12
	Excellent dwarf form. Mats of dark green leaves. Delicate pink lanterns followed by red fruits.		
A023	<b>Arenaria acerosa</b>	Sun Part-sun	\$11
	Bristly stems of short, green leaves make cushions of unusual texture; numerous white flowers on 10cm scapes in spring.		
A108	<b>Arenaria drypidea</b>	Sun Part-sun	\$10
	Leaves arranged in a columnar fashion on short stems producing tight, globose cushions; somewhat like an acantholimon- an adaptation to cold dry conditions; white flowers with red spots; from Ercias Dag, Turkey at 2400m.		
A390	<b>Arenaria ferghanica</b>	Sun	\$11
New	Solitary white flowers. M. Pavelka collection from screes in Tian-Shan, Kyrgyzstan at 3000m.		
A371	<b>Arenaria grandiflora</b>		\$12
	Large white flowers on a dense tuft, just 5-15cm in height. For well drained, neutral to alkaline scree in full sun. M. Rejzek collection from Alpes Maritimes, France at 1250m.		
A024	<b>Arenaria hookeri</b>	Sun Part-sun	\$12
New	Dense cushions of short, green needles; for sunny, dry conditions; white flowers.		
A377	<b>Arenaria hookeri v. desertorum</b>	Sun	\$12
	Very choice, tight, cushion with exceptionally fine needle like leaves; becomes a mound of white blooms in early summer. Alplains collection from Uintah Co., UT at 2302m.		
A312	<b>Arenaria obtusiloba</b>	Sun	\$11
	Mats of trailing stems with tufts of short needles. White blooms in late spring to early summer. Alplains collection from Albany Co., WY, 3310m.		
A025	<b>Arenaria tetraquetra</b>	Sun	\$11
	Dense, hard green mat of tetragonus leaves; many white, stem-less flowers in May. Use as a mat to intergrow with something larger such as dianthus or bulbs.		
A095	<b>Arenaria tetraquetra ssp. granatensis</b>	Sun	\$12
	One of the tightest mats I have seen; ground hugging little hummocks of light green and gold; especially attractive growing on tufa. The white flowers are stemless ~1cm wide. Excellent for combining with other mats or to use as a "dry" underplant for bulbs or a small alpine campanula, gentian or primula.		
A228	<b>Arenaria 'Turkish Frost'</b>	Sun Part-sun	\$10
	Grown from seed from a Czech collection in Turkey, this is not keyed out, but is so good that it must be listed. Narrow blades of grey/green form a dwarf, soft mound; many white flowers with distinctive purple striping are borne in the heat of summer making a valued addition at this time of year; 6cm.		
A051	<b>Arenaria Wallowa Mts</b>	Sun Part-sun	\$10
	Solid hummocks with white flowers on 1 inch stems. A very tight, wonderful cushion.		
A376	<b>Armeria girardii</b>	Sun	\$10
	Grassy tufts of narrow leaves; small pink globes held on threadlike stems; 8-15cm high. Specific to the Caucasus and Dolomite sands; a M. Rejzek collection from Cevennes, France at 1000m.

A053	<b>Asperula daphneola</b> Dense, small, grey-green mats with long, stemless, funnel-shaped pink flowers. Very choice; Pavelka collection from stony slopes of Nif Dag, Turkey.	Sun	\$12

	Ground hugging mats of hard, rubbery foliage. Tiny yellow/green flowers sit on the carpet.

	Low (5-15cm) growing bush with glossy, evergreen leaves; interesting floral orbs of soft cream dot the mat in early spring. For a dry sunny place in neutral, sandy or stony soil. Winter cover against excessive moisture. M. Rejzek collection from Cordillera de Los Andes; 2150m, Neuquen Argentina.		
<b>B024</b>	<b>Baptisia lactea</b>	Sun	\$11
New	White Wild Indigo; blue-green foliage with 100cm tall spikes of white pea flowers. Alplains collection.		
<b>B023</b>	<b>Bellevalia romana</b>	Sun	\$11
New	Spikes of creamy white flowers with night blue anthers. M. Rejzek collection from Appennino tosco-emiliano, Italy at 610m.		
<b>B015</b>	<b>Besseyia alpina</b>	Part-sun	\$12
	Deep violet flowered bottlebrush spikes reach just 15cm in summer. Basal rosettes of ovate tiny toothed leaves. Alplains collection; 3887m, Park Co., CO.		
<b>B012</b>	<b>Besseyia wyomingensis</b>	Sun	\$12
	Delightful purple 'kittentails' on woolly spikes in early spring. Alplains collection from steep east facing limestone slope; Teton Co., MT, 2348m.

	Very dwarf green cushions with many tiny, stemless white and pink flowers. Delicate and choice. Pavelka collection from stony slopes and scree; Sultan Dag, Turkey.

	Cordillera de Los Andes 1330m, Neuquen, Argentina		
<b>C327</b>	<b>Calceolaria filicaulis</b>		\$10
	Rosettes of simple, broad leaves; thin stems topped with clusters of yellow slipper flowers, to 20cm in height. M. Rejzek collection; Cordillera de Los Andes, Mendoza, Argentina at 2520m.		
<b>C320</b>	<b>Calceolaria germainii</b>	Sun Part-sun	\$10
New	Ovate shiny leaves with glandular hairs; yellow slipper flowers with red spots. M. Rejzek collection; Cordillera de Los Andes, Mendoza, Argentina at 2460m.

	Low growing (10cm) dark green spreader - a sweet chance seedling from Bunchberry Nursery in Nova Scotia; lots of lavender flowers.		
<b>C210</b>	<b>Calluna vulgaris 'Annemarie'</b>	Sun Part-sun	\$9
	Dark green heather with double rose/pink flowers; grow in full sun and sandy soil with lots of peat.		
<b>C216</b>	<b>Calluna vulgaris 'Anthony Davis'</b>	Sun Part-sun	\$9
	Long sprays of white flowers over gray/green mats. Low spreading habit.		
<b>C262</b>	<b>Calluna vulgaris 'Arina'</b>	Sun	\$9
	Lilac pink flowers; 30-45 cm tall; gorgeous foliage heather with orange and cream tips in spring.
