| | Tiny dwarf with dense, silver gray leaves to 7cm high; yellow flowers in a thick corymb. Choice and slow growing. Pavelka collection, Ojuklu Dag, Turkey. | | |

| | Toothed, wooly, gray-green leaves form mats with 15cm flower stems that bear corms of pale yellow flowers, which age to cream. | | |
| A0105 | Adenophora takedae v. howozana | Part-sun | \$14 |
| | Campanula relative from Japan; slender arching branches with narrow, toothed leaves. Blue violet bells in very late in August-September; 15cm. | | |
| A0291 | Aethionema armenum | Sun | \$12 |
| New | Compact 10cm evergreen mound of soft pink blooms. Easy to grow and will gently self seed about. M. Pavelka collection from Ak dag Turkey. | | |
| A0419 | Aethionema capitatum | Sun | \$13 |
| | Tiny tuft (4-8cm) of glaucous leaves, delicately covered in pink flowers. M. Pavelka collection from stony slopes, gypsum hills in Kangal, Turkey. | | |
| A0060 | Aethionema glaucescens | Sun Part-sun | \$12 |
| | From Turkey, this low shrublet has blue, needle like foliage with pink blooms in late spring. | | |
| A0005 | Aethionema ibirideum | Sun Part-sun | \$13 |
| | Small growing crucifer with trailing stems forming loose mats; blue gray leaves and maroon stems; white, fragrant flowers. | | |

| New | An excellent species that is similar to A. armenum but with larger pink flowers. M. Pavelka collection from Rafahie, Turkey. | | |
| A0280 | Aethionema saxatilis | Sun | \$12 |
| | Blue-green, thick (almost succulent like) leaves form a low cushion of 10-15cm. Flowers are usually pink, but there is variability with white and mauve as well. Jurasek collection, 1700m Greece. | | |

| New | Tight 10cm mounds of pink flowers and tiny leaves. M. Pavelka collection from stony slopes of Ermenek, Turkey. | | |

| | Gorgeous 60cm blue-gray succulent basal rosette. Very sharp, dark spines. Alplains Davis Mountain collection; Jeff Davis CO., TX, 1860m. Listed for Zone 6-7. | | |

| | Found at 1494m, El Paso Co., Texas. This is a hardy collection with typical dagger like stems and etched patterning. | | |

| | A hardy Alplains collection from Grant Co., NM at 2073m, where it experiences a good amount of winter cold. | | |

| | Slow growing, compact rosettes of blue-grey spiny leaves, giving a disproportionately 10 foot tall stalk of yellow flowers. A hardy collection by Alan Bradhaw from sandstone crevices in Washington Co., UT at 1395m. | | |

| | Dwarf Lady's Mantle with glossy, deep green leaves, enhanced further with silver edges. | | |

| | The sweetest and most desirable blue allium, from Jurasek collection in Qinghai. Tiny clumps of thin sedge like leaves give delicate umbels of blue flowers in late summer. | | |

| New | Tuft of fine, wiry leaves, 15cm tall. Umbels of white flowers with purple veining. M. Rejzek collection from Kopaonik, Serbia at 1140m. | | |

| | Pink flowered allium; from Jurasek seed collected in Rawu, E. Tibet at 4100m. | | |

| | One of the tightest mats I have seen; ground hugging little hummocks of light green and gold; especially attractive growing on tufa. The white flowers are stemless ~1cm wide. | | Grown from seed from a Czech collection in Turkey, this is not keyed out, but is so good that it must be listed. Narrow blades of grey/green form a dwarf, soft mound; many white flowers with distinctive purple striping are borne in the heat of summer making a valued addition at this time of year; 6cm. | | |
| A0051 | Arenaria Wallowa Mts | Sun Part-sun | \$13 |
| | Solid green hummocks with white flowers on 1 inch stems. A very tight, wonderful cushion. | | |
| A0028 | Armeria juniperifolia | Sun Part-sun | \$13 |
| | Hummock forming Spanish Thrift, very compact; lots of pink flowers on 5cm stems. | | |

| | Purple flowers on dwarf 10cm clump. J. Jurasek collection, Korab, Macedonia (JJ23.93) | | |

| | Mound of purple flowers 5-15 cm high. M. Rejzek collection from Pirin, Bulgaria at 2080m. | | |

| | Large, and extremely thin petalled purple daisy - that's what makes it striking. A taller alpine, at 20-45 cm. Jurasek collection, N. Qinghai, 3600m. | | |

| | Hot magenta blooms from August to September. Only ~20cm tall. | | |

| | Tidy 30cm mound, multitude of purple flowers with yellow centres in late summer to early fall. Disease resistant. | | |
